
Race Night 2011 - Mini Break in Bridlington

We are very grateful to the Manager of the Expanse Hotel who has donated the first prize for our raffle as part of Race Night 2011 The prize consists of a two nights Bed & Breakfast stay at The Expanse Hotel, Bridlington. In addition to this splendid first prize there will be 30 of prizes of £10 each.

For those of you who have not participated in Race Night before, this is what happens: We offer ownership of imaginary horses as an absent owner at £5 per horse, you can name it yourself or we will invent a name for you. These are then made up into races of 10 horses and an Absent Owners Race Card is printed. Last year Samuel Beales, a greatgrandson of our founder Sydney Norgate, drew the cover design for the race card. His drawing is shown here. On race day we draw out the winners and a prize is sent to the winner of each race. We also have the raffle tickets at 20p each or £1 per book of 5 with cash prizes. Alternatively you may wish to make an optional donation rather than taking part in the races or raffle. We do need all requests for horses and ticket stubs by the 21st October to give us a chance to organise everything.

There is a space on the form for you to request extra books of 5 raffle tickets to sell to others. If you fill this in and send it to me I will be happy to send you the requested number of books. You are under no obligation to sell all of the tickets you request and part books sold are fine. Please remember to order early, as all ticket stubs have to be back to the office by 21st October.





We hope you can participate again this year; a form is enclosed for your reply. I hope you will get some fun out of it and that we can raise a useful sum to continue the work of the trust.

If you are making a donation and are a taxpayer, please consider signing the declaration on the back of the Race Night form. It would increase your donation at no extra cost to you. I am pleased to tell you that we have been able to reclaim over £6000 from the Inland Revenue under the Gift Aid scheme so far.

We fully understand that people's circumstances are different, that they may have moral or religious objections and that some of our members are less mobile than others.


Laryngectomy is not a Tragedy



Press Don't Panic Button - Speaks When You Can't

Following brain surgery Sam Docherty developed epilepsy. There was nothing available to reduce seizure anxiety so he developed an audio device which could be worn visibly to alert anyone if he was in difficulty.

The Press Don't Panic button device allows medical information to be recorded and stored by the wearer in any language, which can then be played back repeatedly when required. The play back can be initiated by the wearer or by those offering assistance.

The Press Don't Panic Button device is designed primarily for sufferers of conditions which make it likely that they will require assistance in public places from members of the general public without medical training as such it could prove very useful for a laryngectomee.
